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ELIGIBILITY

All Washington state residents who are legally blind, visually impaired, deaf-blind, cannot hold a book or turn pages, or have a reading disability due to an organic dysfunction are eligible for service.

Organizations that serve eligible populations, for example, public libraries, hospitals, care facilities and schools, are eligible for an account. Teachers of the visually impaired can also set up accounts for their students.



OUR COLLECTION

WTBBL has a wide range of titles in audio, braille, and large print. There is much to choose from, and you can depend on our Readers' Advisors to help find reading material that you will enjoy.

WTBBL also loans magazines, music scores, and foreign language titles. We can connect you to your favorite publications and the information you need. Access to materials is also available through the Braille and Audio Reading Download (BARD) website or via an app for your mobile device, both in iOS and Android platforms.

YOUTH SERVICES

WTBBL provides innovative services and programming for youth of all ages. Our youth collection provides braille, print-braille, audiobooks, and downloadable books through the BARD app. Our by-mail summer reading program, pen pal program, storytimes, and special in-house events throughout the year promote literacy and family engagement.

Schools and school districts that serve eligible students can register for accounts so students can receive materials in the classroom. In addition, WTBBL's Youth Services Librarian provides outreach and support to educators and youth-serving organizations throughout the state of Washington.
